The transportation situation across North County Dublin is already stretched to its limits and will only worsen with our growing population as national promises for the Dart and Metrolink have fallen short.

- Lobbied for safe segregated bike lanes to and from Rush & Lusk station, and Rogerstown Park
- Raised need for expansion of subsidised rental bikes schemes, pedal and E-bike

- Supported residents pushing back on Airport noise pollution
- Introduced motions to regulate Data Centre electricity use in the county

The need for early childhood facilities

The need for education and childcare has already outpaced demand across the North County. **As your local Councillor, I have:**

- Pushed for the delivery of promised creche buildings, and resisted efforts by some developers to remove these commitments
- Promoted the need for more multidenominational and Gaelscoil school places
- Introduced motions demanding local public swimming pool facilities and recreational spaces for kids and teenagers

Why local government doesn't work for us

After elections, ruling groups of Councillors decide a policy agenda and divvy up Mayors & Chairs in secrecy. Over 30 years, these have been a mix of FG/ Labour/ FF, & sometimes Greens or Indos, never revealing their Governing Agreement for public scrutiny. If re- elected, I'll push for a transparent and progressive ruling group that puts people first.
